GENERAL INSTRUCTIONS

1. It is the responsibility of the parents to send their ward to school in time.
2. Students should not be sent to the school when they are sick, very particularly when they are suffering from infectious diseases like measles, chicken pox etc.
3. Parents should ensure that their ward does not bring unauthorised books, magazines, mobile phone etc. into the school. Things will not be given back to the students.
4. Students should always be in proper uniform and should conduct themselves in a dignified manner at all times.
5. The School is not responsible for any injury (or harm) that a student may sustain during school hours or during his/her pursuit of any other curricular activity.
6. Parents should send an application stating leave of absence of their ward to the school in case a student is not attending the school.
7. Any damage caused to any item of school property shall be viewed seriously. In case your ward indulges in any breakage, he/she shall have to pay the recovery.
8. If a parent wishes to withdraw his ward from the School it is obligatory on the part of the parents to inform the School authorities in writing at least a month in advance failing which a monthly tuition fee shall have to be paid to secure transfer certificate in lieu of student withdrawal.
9. Name of the student will be struck off from the rolls if he/she is found absent from the school for continuous six days without information. A fresh procedure for re-admission will be followed on arrival.
10. Maintenance and cleanliness of the school campus is the responsibility of all including your ward.
11. If any parent visits the school on days other than parents' teacher's meeting day, he/she shall enter the details in the register with the gate man.
12. Parents are requested to be properly dressed during their visit to the school.
13. Parents should give sufficient attention and time to their children and help them in their studies at home.
14. The parents should not ask their ward to come home during school hours until or unless there is an emergency or dire urgency.

15. Students must note home-work in the diary. Parents should see the diary daily and see that the child does the home-work sincerely and properly.
16. No student should leave the school premises during the school hours including recess, without recommendation of the class teacher and permission of the Principal.
17. The school is not responsible for goods lost. It is not advisable to bring valuable articles, expensive jewellery and watches etc. to the school.
18. Cycles must be kept locked and parked in the cycle stand.
19. Non-Sikh boys should get their hair trimmed at intervals.
20. Trimming of beard and hair cut by Sikh boys is prohibited. Defaulters name will be struck off from the School without listening any excuse.
21. Turban is compulsory from Class 9th onward for Sikh boys.
22. Students should submit their Report Cards signed by their Guardians within two days.
23. Attendance of students during Nagar Kirtan is compulsory.
24. The school reserves to itself the right to expel students whose diligence and progress is unsatisfactory or whose conduct is harmful to other students.
25. Students can take refund security within one month after leaving the school.

Remarks made in the diary must be seen and signed regularly. The students should be helped to develop respect for regular hard work. Parents are requested to ensure that fees are paid on time. They are requested to provide the children with proper text books, note books, stationery etc. at the beginning of the session and ensure that their children diligently attend to the Home-Work, Class Tests, the Unit Tests, the Term Tests and the Annual Examination. As far as possible leave should be avoided.

Leave application will not be entertained without the signature of the parents. All leaves should be prior sanctioned. For long leaves, parents should discuss the matter personally to Principal. The students will not be allowed to leave the Campus without

the permission of Class Teacher and Principal. Parents are requested to discourage their wards from bringing private cars, scooters etc. for coming to school.

PROCEDURE FOR WITHDRAWAL

Students can be withdrawn or removed from the School as under:-

- a) By giving one Calendar Month's notice in writing. In the absence of such a notice, one month's fee will be charged.
- b) By the School Authorities on any of the following grounds:-

 - 2) Irregularity in attendance.
 - 3) Behaviour problem.

 - 6) Moral breach considered serious by the School Committee.
 - 7) Those repeating the same class for two years.
- c) **For withdrawal after March 31st, Fees for the 1st quarter will have to be paid.**

FEE DEPOSIT

The school fee and funds should be deposited with office clerk, quarterly (in the month of April, July, October and January) from 1st to 15th of these months between 8.00 A.M. to 12.00 Noon Thereafter fine of Rs. 10/- will be charged till 20th of the month and after 20th fine of Rs. 10/- per day will be charged.
